The Field Days will include 2 field trips to organic dairies in Nichols, NY, a producers' meeting and banquet, a trade show, workshops on Saturday and plenty of time to enjoy conversation and excellent, local organic food.

This will be followed by a producers and NODPA members' meeting which will include an update on the NOP rule changes, an opportunity for producers to discuss their priorities for the next year and exchange ideas on issues related to pay price and parity.

The Saturday morning proceedings will be opened by Steve Morrison, NODPA's President, followed by "Measuring The Health of your Soil": Janice Degni, and Fay Benson of Cornell's South Central NY Dairy and Field Crop Team will use some of the practices that have been discussed in their winter soil health meetings to show farmers how to measure the health of their farm soils. Klaas Martens will then lead a workshop on soil fertility management. Jim and Nancy Gardiner will talk about medicinal and nutritional uses of medicinal herbs as part of a workshop on livestock health care. At 12:30 we will have lunch where the raffle of a calf donated by Pam and Rob Moore and door prizes will take place. At 2:00 p.m. we will take a field trip to Moore Farms to look at milking parlor design in their New Zealand style swing parlor, grazing management with a seasonal dairy herd raising calves on cows, once a day milking and strategies for reducing grain feeding. Dale Emmick will participate in the farm walk and lead a discussion on pasture management. There will also be many opportunities for farmers to visit the trade show, network with one another, and meet resource people in the organic dairy industry.
